GREENWOOD COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING FEBRUARY 28TH, 2022

Chairman Roy Ballard called the regular meeting of the Greenwood County Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. Other members present were Ben Fox, Chuck Spradlin, Paul Hodge, Robert Morgan, County Counselor Paul Dean and County Clerk Kathy Robison.

Commissioners led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Spradlin moved to approve February 22nd, 2022 Minutes, as written. Fox seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Road and Bridge report:

- > Road and Bridge was able to purchase the truck that was approved at a previous meeting; said truck is slated for delivery later today.
- > Tree removal on 60th is complete.
- > New teeth for the bobcat have arrived.
- A brief discussion ensued regarding a Road and Bridge employee's interest in moving to the Noxious Weed Department. No decisions were made regarding this matter.
- Darrel is slated to look at the road just north of the bridge in Reece, as commissioner Morgan reported a gouge in the road.

Commissioners reviewed Treasurer's Report. No decisions were made.

Hodge moved to approve Jesse James Cross for Fall River Township Clerk. Morgan seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Emergency Management Director Levi Vinson informed commissioners that the annual renewal in the amount of \$4,600.80 for the CODE RED system is due.

Hodge moved to approve the renewal of the CODE RED contract in the amount of \$4,600.80. Fox seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Levi reported that the Health Department has enough grant funds to purchase two electronic message boards in the amount 0f \$43,716.40, which would include freight. After speaking with Health Department employees, Vinson learned that the Health Department would need to submit the bid to the State of Kansas for approval before any further discussion could take place.

Commissioners made the decision to post-pone the discussion regarding the "30-30 Land Grab" for a later date.

Ambulance Director Brian Mongeau informed commissioners that Woodson County EMS is not currently operable as their new ambulance has hit a deer and is out of commission. Mongeau reported that surrounding counties, including Greenwood, will help respond to Woodson county's EMS calls.

Fox moved to approve an executive session to discuss legal matters. Ballard seconded. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting reconvened at 10:10 a.m. No decisions were made.

Spradlin moved to approve a five-minute executive session to discuss employee performance. Fox seconded. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting to reconvene at 10:16 a.m. No decisions were made.

Fox moved to adjourn at 10:23 a.m. Morgan seconded. Motion carried 5-0.
